

OLD SETTLER, MRS. A. HART, PASSES AWAY

Had Been Bedfast for Ten Years

Beautiful floral offerings were piled high in the home of Mrs. Anna Hart, 4829 Prairie Ave., Tuesday noon when Rev. Moses Jackson, pastor of Grace Presbyterian church, of which she was a member, officiated at her funeral rites. The sermon, full of inspiration, was reckoned unto her life, sweet and beautiful.

Miss Joale Roberts presided at the piano and sang the favorite song of the deceased, "Looking This Way." William Seltzer offered two selections, "Asleep in Jesus" and "Gates Ajar," and E. She contracted pneumonia one week ago and passed away Saturday, with her three daughters, Mrs. Anna Hayman-Gibbs, Mrs. Grace Hart Wilson and Miss Gertrude Hart, and her grandson, Claude Alexander, at her bedside.
